Getting there and getting around

Reunion hotel: The San Diego Marriott Hotel & Marina, 333 West Harbor Drive, San Diego, CA 92101 619-234-1500. By agreement between the hotel and the VHPA, we are using the Passkey System to make, modify and cancel hotel reservations. It is important to know that calls directly to the hotel or any of Marriott's regular toll free reservations numbers result in the caller being asked to use the Passkey toll free number. There are two ways to use Passkey:

- Online via the VHPA Booking Website in Passkey. You can paste the following link in a browser to get to the Passkey Website.

The VHPA Registration Website has a link to this Passkey Website once you complete your Reunion Registration process.

- Toll Free Passkey reservation line is 800-266-9432. Callers say they want to make a Passkey reservation and need to mention any number of keywords such as "VHPA" or "VHPA Reunion" so the agent can find the contract.

Vicinity Around the Hotel: The hotel is sandwiched between the San Diego Convention Center and the Hyatt hotel. West Harbor Drive is to the front and a large marina to the rear protected by the embarcadero. The hotel Concierge provides a walking map to the famous Gaslamp Quarter and to Seaport Village on the embarcadero. Literally there are more than 100 restaurants and shops within easy walking distance from the hotel. There is also a large grocery store, Ralph's, three blocks from the hotel. On check-in you will also receive a San Diego Visitor's Guidebook that has details for the greater metropolitan area. If you are not into walking there is a liberal supply of Pedal Cabs all around the hotel and the downtown area. The San Diego Trolley (light rail system) Convention Center Station is immediately in front of the hotel.

Overflow Hotel: (Added on 18 May) Since the Marriott is nearly sold out, we arranged for the Hilton San Diego Gaslamp Quarter to be an overflow hotel. It is located at 401 K Street, San Diego 92101. This is two short blocks from the Marriott. Call 619-231-4040 or 800-HILTONS.

Official Airline: We have two options:

- American Airlines: For the period June 26 – July 11, 2010 for travel to San Diego, CA, the Promotion Code is **6460AR**. Receive a 5% discount off the lowest applicable eligible published air fare. The percentage discount can be booked online at www.AA.com for American Airlines and American Eagle flights only. At this time there is no ticketing fee for reservations made and ticketed on www.AA.com. Reservations may also be made via telephone by calling the Meeting Services Desk at 800-433-1790 from anywhere in the United States or Canada and refer to the Promotion Code. There will be a separate ticketing charge

of \$20.00 USD per ticket for tickets purchased via the phone or \$30.00 USD per ticket for tickets purchased at the airport. This amount is subject to change.

- United Airlines: For the period June 27 – July 8, 2010 for travel to San Diego, CA, the Promotion Code is **586QG** from the domestic 48 States, Hawaii, and Canada. Receive a 5% discount off the lowest applicable eligible published air fare or a 7% to 10% discount for over 30 days advanced ticketing for certain booking codes. The percentage discount can be booked on-line at www.UAL.com for United Airlines, United Express, and United code share flights operated by Island Air or Great Lakes only. Reservations may also be made via telephone by calling the Meeting Services Desk at 800-521-4041 from anywhere in the United States or Canada and refer to the Promotion Code.
- Please know that we tried to obtain a similar program with Southwest Airlines and were told they do not discount off their already low fares.

Official Rental Car: We have two options:

- Avis has special rates available from seven days before to seven days after the Reunion. The Avis Worldwide Discount (AWD) number is **G028272**. Call Avis directly at 888-754-8878 or by using the link provided below.

- Hertz has special rates from June 23 through July 12. Cars can be picked up from any corporate Southern California location (including the Marriott's lobby) and returned to any other Southern California location! Use hertz.com or 800-654-2240 and the CV# **022L2989**.

Airport to Hotel: The airport is 3.1 miles from the hotel. The hotel does not provide shuttle service. For less than \$10 you can take a taxi or for even less than that a shuttle van to the hotel. The VHPA arranged for a group discount via Cloud 9/SuperShuttle. There are several ways to arrange for a ride. First, go to www.supershuttle.com and use the group code **PXE6Z**. Second, call 800-258-3826. You can book your return trip as well. Once you have booked your ride, here is how it works. After collecting your luggage, take the sky bridge or cross walk over to the ground transportation islands. Look for the island with a blue sign overhead that reads 'Shuttles for Hire.' Show the driver your reservation with the discount. Warning – the drivers MAY GET snippy with you if you just walk up and demand the discount. They are supposed to honor it but ... so use the phone or website.

Hotel to Airport: If you didn't book your return trip via Cloud 9/SuperShuttle, check with the Concierge Desk or the Bell Captains at the front door for the van schedule. They run about every 15 minutes and cost about \$7 per person.

Amtrak to/from Hotel: The Santa Fe Amtrak Station (also known as the America Plaza Transfer Station for the San Diego Light Rail system) is less than one mile from the hotel. From the Santa Fe Station you can take a taxi, shuttle, or Light Rail Orange Line train two stops to the Convention Center Station that is immediately in front of the hotel.

Parking: WARNING!! Overnight hotel parking is \$22 per night for self-parking and \$32 for valet. Parking near the hotel is less but not by much. Even the SoCal members don't have a cheaper answer to this challenge.

RV Parking: Recommend starting with the Mission Bay RV Resort. Go to www.missionbayrvresort.com or call 858-270-4300. Their park is about 8 miles from the hotel. Another is Campland on the Bay RV Park. Go to www.campland.com or call 800-422-9386. It is close by Mission Bay, is more expensive and more crowded. Many people like it better because it has a restaurant, a private beach and a swimming pool.

Power Scooter: For anyone wishing to rent a power scooter, wheel chair, etc. while you are in San Diego. Please call 888-441-7575 or www.scootaround.com/rentals/s/sandiego/.

Tours and Buses: Unless otherwise noted all tours begin at the 'coach loading point' near the fountain in front of the hotel. While the Concierge Desk or the Bell Captains at the front door will point this location out to you, it is easy to find. Exit the front door of the hotel, take a left and walk down the hill. The Fountain is on your right and the bus loading point is in the parking lot access driveway before you reach Harbor Drive.

Reunion Sponsorship

Reunion Dress Code

California casual is the dress code for this Reunion with some obvious reminders and suggestions as follows:

- A jacket and long pants are a VERY GOOD idea whenever you go out on the water. Remember the USS Midway is high over the water. The first thing the SoCal local guys have to say is “Bring a jacket!” This applies to the Harbor Cruise as well.
- Many men wear a suit and tie with the ladies wearing a nice dress to the Closing Banquet. You will even see Dress Blues.
- It is always a good idea to wear your Reunion lanyard.
- Since the area around the hotel is near the ocean, the outdoor temperatures will be just about perfect night or day. However, Ramona Airport where we will fly in the helicopters is about 30 miles from the water. It can be HOT waiting to get in the helicopter and then BREEZY during the flight.

Reunion Events

Ground Zero for this Reunion is the 3rd Floor in the South Tower. Please know that the Lobby Level is also the 2nd Floor. So once you get to Starbucks in the South Tower, take the escalator up to the 3rd Floor. Registration, the Vendor Room, the Keg Beer Room, the unit TOCs, the Early Bird and Welcome Receptions, most of the Mini-Reunions, the Annual Business Meeting, the WSC/HPFs, etc. will all happen on the 3rd Floor of the South Tower. Most of these events will be in various sections of the Marina Ballroom.

San Diego & Old Town Tour: Buses leave from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 10:30 a.m. return to the hotel about 2:30 p.m. This tour is a great introduction to San Diego. Highlights include some of the most famous sites of San Diego including the Gas-Lamp Quarter, La Jolla, Coronado, Balboa Park, and Old Town. Board your coach for a narrated tour of San Diego and experience the many diversified and unique areas of this beautiful city. Your tour includes the vibrant downtown, the *Gas-Lamp Quarter*, with its old world buildings, and the *Embarcadero*, offering a wonderful harbor view. Ride through famous *Balboa Park*, home of the *San Diego Zoo*; *La Jolla*, known as the jewel of the Pacific, and see the historic landmark *Hotel Del Coronado*. You’ll get off the bus in *Old Town*, discovered by Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo in 1542, and often considered California’s birthplace. Here you will find the history and energy of the original settlement of the city of San Diego brought to life by history-tellers, free museums, historic displays, plaques and time lines. Lunch will be on your own in *Old Town*, where you’ll find many restaurants and cafes to choose from. After lunch, explore the village and discover superb shopping and many small galleries. This will be a great day out!

USS Midway Audio Tour I: Buses leave from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 12:30 a.m. return to the hotel about 5:00 p.m. This self-guided audio tour of the USS Midway offers 25 restored aircraft and 60 exciting exhibits from the powerful engine room to the Conning Tower & Bridge. She was firing Tomahawk Missiles during the Liberation of Kuwait and now the *USS Midway* begins her final tour of duty in the heart of downtown San Diego's waterfront area. One of the true icons of the U.S. Navy in the latter half of the 20th century, she is a modern marvel. This is the most modern warship available for general touring today. You will take a look back at the history of America’s longest serving Aircraft Carrier through many of the museum exhibits. The *Midway Museum* tour is a self guided audio tour which allows you to tour at your own pace. Elevator access is available to 75% of the exhibits. The tour will take you through the hangar deck and up onto the flight deck. There is a gift shop and café on-board.

Harbor Sightseeing Cruise: Buses leave from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 3:45 p.m. and return to the hotel about 6:45 p.m. Enjoy a 2-hour, fully narrated, harbor tour, including Harbor & Shelter Islands, Point Loma, Cabrillo National Monument, North Island Naval Air Station, the Submarine Base, the Coronado Bridge & much more. Board your yacht and embark on a 2-hour Harbor Tour. This is a fully narrated tour, which passes by awesome Naval Bases (there are usually warships in

port), the munitions bunkers, and attack helicopters. You will also sail under the *Coronado Bridge*, to *Point Loma* to see the *Cabrillo Monument*. Snacks, drinks and bathrooms are all available on-board.

Reception for 1st Reunion Attendees: Marina 'D' from 7 to 8 p.m. VHPA President Gary Roush and Secretary/Treasurer Tom Payne (along with the rest of the Executive Council and several VHPA Committee Chairman) provide a special welcome to all 1st Timers. They will present a brief history of the VHPA and will answer questions. Immediately following this reception, we simply open an air wall to join the Welcome Reception.

Welcome Reception: Marina 'D' 'E' and 'F' from 8 p.m. until whenever. Because more people are involved, this will be an "expanded version" of the previous night's Early Bird Reception. Find your unit's table, bring your unit banners to hang up, join with the SoCal guys (plus the VHPA Executive Council members and Committee Chairs), be prepared to meet old friends and to make new ones. USS Midway: Remember rule #1 – Bring a jacket because it is cool on the flight deck when the sun goes down. Remember rule #2 – We are going to time sequence the bus loading at the hotel to avoid all 1,000 of us standing in line. The plan is to issue **a bus loading ticket** AND **a Midway boarding ticket**. We’ll provide more details on these two tickets at a later time. Buses start leaving from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) about 6:00 p.m. and basically circle to the hotel until about 11:00 p.m. Visit www.midway.org for a visual taste! The USS Midway is the Number 1 attraction in San Diego (it eclipsed the famous Zoo several years ago) and you will enjoy it in very special ways:

- Wings and Rotors Museum (www.wingsandrotors.org) will land their restored UH-1B. It will shut down and be wheeled to join the five helicopters on permanent display on the flight deck. An active-duty Naval Helicopter Squadron may provide an SH-60 Seahawk “escort” for the Huey.
- VHPA Founder, Larry Clark, plans to bring a newly restored HA(L)-3 Seawolf UH-1B to the Reunion. If at all possible Larry will also land this UH-1B on the Midway, so we could have two Hueys landing during the program.
- A special program featuring Navy helicopter pilots who flew in and off Vietnam during the war.
- A BBQ meal cooked on the flight deck. There will be several serving areas to minimize waiting in line. Cash bars.
- Docents will provide below deck tours to two special areas – the History of the Navy Helicopter Exhibit and the restored Helicopter Ready Room plus the Junior Officers Berthing area - where the helicopter pilots bunked. (During a catered

event like ours, only the top two decks plus the tower are open. These docents help us experience the helicopter side of the Midway. Since it takes about four hours to get the 'full experience' we've arranged separate Audio Tours for Reunion Attendees on July 1st and 3rd.)

- Light entertainment featuring a USO Band.

Saturday, July 3rd

Coronado Parade: (Updated on 21 May) Old Towne Trolleys start leaving from the Trolley pickup point (across the street from the Marriott) at 7:30 a.m. and return to the hotel about 3:00 p.m. All those who purchase the VHPA ticket for the Coronado Parade will exchange them for an Old Towne Trolley ticket prior to boarding the Trolley. The Old Towne Trolley ticket is valid on any Trolley for the entire Reunion visit. Since San Diego is such a military supporting community the Coronado Parade is very special indeed. The SoCal Chapter and the Distinguished Flying Cross Society participate in this parade every year. They invited any and all VHPAers to join them. Over 100,000 people are expected to participate or view this parade. Warning! Traffic over the Coronado Bridge is SPECIAL for this event, so we this is way we chartered the Trolleys. Helicopter Museum and Rides: (Updated on 21 May) Buses start leaving from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 9:00 a.m. and return to the hotel about 2:00 p.m. The Ramona Airport is home to the Classic Rotors Museum (www.rotors.org) which has a flyable CH-21. The Wings & Rotors Museum (www.wingsandrotors.org) plans to position their flyable UH-1B at Ramona for this event. Helistream Helicopters plans to position a flyable Super Huey (Bell 205A++) at Ramona for this event. 12-minute flights in the Super Huey are possible. Additionally, Larry Clark plans to position his restored UH-1B at Ramona but it can't accommodate riders. Finally, Al Doucette plans to display and possibly fly some special (built from scratch) radio controlled helicopters (including a CH-21) near the Classic Rotors Museum's building. - Basic Museum Tour option – includes bus transportation, lunch w/drink, entrance to the Classic Rotors Museum plus 'photo opportunity' access to the helicopters mentioned above. Anyone planning to fly in a helicopter during this event must purchase a Basic Museum Tour ticket. If ever you want to give your family members an "up close and personal" helicopter experience – this is the event for you!!
- Overseas Aircraft, the company Larry Clark works for, is going the extra, extra mile to restore a UH-1B (tail number 327) that actually served with HA(L)-3 in Vietnam. The restoration effort plans to be completely accurate down to the smallest detail – instruments, weapons, seats, EVERYTHING. After the VHPA Reunion, they will fly it to Oshkosh for the EAA fly-in and air show and then to the main HA(L)-3 Reunion in November 2010 in Charleston, SC.
- (Updated on 21 May) Previously the Reunion Committee offered rides in the "museum helicopters" (the CH-21, OH-58, and UH-1B). For liability insurance

reasons we had to withdraw that option. However both Classic Rotors Museum and the Wings & Rotors Museum will put on an “air show” of sorts. They will start up the CH-21 and the UH-1B, bring them to a hover, fly around a little, then shut down again. You will be able to go inside the helicopters, put people in seats, take pictures, etc. All those who purchased CH-21, OH-58, or UH-1B ride tickets will be offered a ride in the Super Huey and a refund of the price differential.

- **(Updated on 21 May)** Helisteam is a commercial helicopter company licensed to carry passengers. They will provide about 12-minute flights around the Ramona Airport area for those who purchase a ticket from the VHPA.

Balboa Park 4 Museum Tour I: Buses leave from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 9:30 a.m. and return to the hotel about 4:30 p.m. San Diego’s renowned urban cultural center, Balboa Park is home to 15 major museums, lovely gardens, and many other cultural and recreational attractions. Your day pass allows you to select 4 of the Parks’ Museums that interest you the most. Spend the day at *Balboa Park* - a special place where you can experience San Diego’s natural beauty, wonderful art and culture and stunning Spanish Revival architecture. Your motor coach will take you to the *Air & Space Museum*. You may choose to visit the museum or board the free tram at the museum to begin your day at an alternate attraction. Your pass provides complimentary admission to any 4 museums you choose. Some of the other options include the *Museums of Art, Photography, International Culture, San Diego History, Automotive, Sports, Model Railroad, Natural History, the Science Center, Japanese Friendship Garden* and much more. This is the “Smithsonian Museum of the west”. Be sure to stop by the visitor’s center, which includes an exceptional gift shop featuring regional maps, books, apparel, and much more. You will be provided a list of available museums, as well as a tram map to help you plan your day. The park offers restaurants for lunch on your own. The motor coach will depart from the *Air & Space Museum* at 4:00pm to return to the hotel.

San Diego Zoo I: Buses leave from the bus loading point (near the fountain on Harbor Drive) at 9:30 a.m. and return to the hotel about 4:30 p.m. San Diego Zoo is home to many rare and intriguing creatures from nearly every region of the world. With more than 4,000 animals representing 800 species, the zoo is home to a diverse collection of animals, many of which are rarely seen at other zoos. Spend the day at the famous *San Diego Zoo*, where you will have plenty of time to visit some of the most popular attractions, as well as personal places of interest. Don’t miss Mei Sheng, the second baby panda born at the *San Diego Zoo*, this is truly one of the most unique and most beloved species on the planet - and very few are ever seen outside their native habitat in northern China. The tour will take you through the hangar deck and up onto the flight deck. There is a gift shop and café on-board.
